2016 College Savings Mississippi Tuition Toss - Egg Bowl

NO PURCHASE OF A MACS OR MPACT ACCOUNT NECESSARY TO ENTER TO WIN
VOID WHERE PROHIBITED

CONTEST DESCRIPTION AND TIMING: The 2016 College Savings Mississippi Tuition Toss (the “Contest”) will be held during the 2016 football game between The University of Mississippi and Mississippi State University on November 26, 2016 (the “Egg Bowl”). For the Contest, a select number of students will be chosen to participate by tossing and making a specified number of footballs in the specified target within the time provided. Must be at least 18 years of age to complete an entry form to participate in the Contest.

CONTEST SPONSOR AND CONTEST ENTITIES: College Savings Mississippi, a division of the Office of the Mississippi State Treasurer, is the “Contest Sponsor” or “Sponsor” and is located at 501 North West Street, Suite 1101, Jackson, MS 39201; 601-359-5255. Contest Sponsor, together with IMG College, LLC; Marlo Kirkpatrick Creative, LLC; The University of Mississippi; and Mississippi State University are referred to herein as “Contest Entities.”

ELIGIBILITY: The Contest is open to any student currently enrolled at a Mississippi Public 4-year University. Eligible MS Public Universities include: Alcorn State University, Delta State University, Jackson State University, Mississippi State University, Mississippi University for Women, Mississippi Valley State University, University of Mississippi, and University of Southern Mississippi. Entrants must be at least **18 years of age but not older than 24 years of age on 11/26/16**. Members of the immediate family or household of employees of the Office of the Mississippi State Treasurer are not eligible for the Contest. Immediate family means spouses, parents, children, siblings and step-parents, -children, -siblings, whether or not living at the same residence. The Contest is limited to the first 1,000 students who complete an entry in accordance with these rules.

HOW TO ENTER: To enter the Contest, eligible students (“Entrants”) must complete an entry form during a specified time frame. Two Entrants will be selected at random to become “Contestants.” In addition, two Alternates will be selected at random from the remaining Entrants. Alternates must also meet all eligibility criteria. If for any reason, at the discretion of the Sponsor, an Entrant is unable to participate in the Contest, a previously selected Alternate will participate in the Contest in his/her place.

- 1) **COMPLETE OFFICIAL REGISTRATION.** Information and survey entry form available at the Office of the State Treasurer’s website, www.treasurerlynfnitch.com. To be validly entered in the contest, Official Registration must be completed and submitted by the Entrant by 11:45 p.m. on November 15, 2016.
- 2) **ENTRANTS MUST BE PRESENT AT TIME OF ASSEMBLY AND CONTEST.** As noted above, two Alternates will be chosen to compete in place of any Contestant who is unable or not present to compete.
- 3) **CONTESTANTS AND ALTERNATES ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR INDIVIDUAL ADMISSION TO THE 2016 EGG BOWL IN OXFORD, MS ON NOVEMBER 26, 2016.** The Sponsor will **NOT** provide entry to the game for Contestants or Alternates.

LIMIT: One Contestant per immediate family for this Contest period. In the event more than one Contestant from a family is selected, the first Entrant chosen will be considered the only valid Contestant for said family and a replacement for the second Entrant from that family will be chosen.

CONTESTANT SELECTION: Contestants will be selected at random by the Sponsor. The selected Contestants will be notified at least one week prior to the Egg Bowl and must be present one hour prior to the start of the Egg Bowl game start time. Any selected Contestant who does not confirm his/her participation at the time of contact (after

two attempts) will be considered void and an Alternate will take his/her place for the Contest. Entrants understand, if selected, they will be required to toss footballs at a specified target from a distance set by the Sponsor. Contestants also understand they will be responsible for gaining entrance to the game. Verification of admission ticket may be required by the Sponsor at the time of Contestant selection.

CONTEST RULES: Only two Contestants will be chosen to compete in the Contest. At the same time, both Contestants will have the opportunity to toss as many footballs, up to 30 (provided by the Sponsor), as possible within 30 seconds from a location assigned by the Sponsor into the assigned Target on a CSM Apparatus located at a position assigned by the Sponsor. No warm-up or trial tosses by the Contestants will be permitted. The Contestant with the most successful tosses will be declared the winner. The runner-up will win a Runner-Up Prize. In the event of a tie, both Contestants will be awarded a MACS Scholarship. Contestants must comply with all Contest rules and requirements (including attendance at Sponsor's designated meetings) in order to remain eligible for Contest participation and prizes, at the sole determination of the Sponsor. Contestants must wear soft-soled shoes only (no metal cleats) for the Contest, and must attempt all passes without gloves or any throwing aid or any third-party assistance of any kind. Tosses must pass from the Contestant's hands, fully through the assigned Target, without touching the ground or any object or surface other than the CSM Apparatus, all as solely determined by the Sponsor or its judge, in order to be considered a "Successful Toss." All of the Sponsor's and/or its judge's decisions regarding positioning of Contestants or Alternates, timing of tosses, and other details of the Contest shall be final.

WINNER SELECTION/VERIFICATION: If the selected winner does not meet the eligibility or other requirements, he/she will be disqualified. The winner will be required to complete, execute, and return within a specified time an Affidavit of Eligibility, Publicity Release, and MACS application or the Prize (defined below) will be forfeited and awarded to the runner-up Contestant. In the event the runner-up is awarded the prize, the same requirements described above will apply to the runner-up. If the runner-up fails to comply with the requirements, the Prize will be forfeited and will remain in the Sponsor's possession.

PRIZES / APPROXIMATE RETAIL VALUE (ARV): One prize of \$5,529.00 will be awarded to the winner of the Contest. The winning prize will be in the form of a MACS Account for the benefit of a child designated by the winner, or the winner himself/herself. The appropriate Account Owner, according to the MACS rules and regulations, will be required to fill out the necessary paperwork in order to claim the prize. A runner-up prize may also be in the form of a MACS Account. The appropriate Account Owner, according to the MACS rules and regulations, will also be required to fill out the necessary paperwork in order to claim the prize.

GENERAL PRIZE RESTRICTIONS: The Account Owner will be responsible for all federal, state, and local taxes applicable to acceptance and use of the prize, including income taxes, if any, and will be required to provide his/her Social Security Number or Federal Taxpayer Identification Number for tax reporting purposes. Any and all costs associated with acceptance and use of the prize will be the sole responsibility of the winner. Sponsor will file an IRS Form 1099 with the Internal Revenue Service for the fair market value of prize. No transfer or substitution of the prize is permitted, except by the Sponsor, who reserves the right to substitute the prize, in whole or in part, for one of comparable or greater value.

AGREEMENT TO THE OFFICIAL RULES: By participating in the Contest, each Entrant fully and unconditionally agrees to and accepts these Official Rules and the decisions of the Sponsor, the Judges, and the Administrator, which are final and binding in all matters related to the Contest.

RELEASE: By participating, Entrants and their parents or legal guardians agree to release and hold harmless the Contest Entities, and their respective trustees, directors, officers, agents, affiliates, and employees (collectively, "Released Parties") from any and all liability for any claims, costs, injuries, losses, or damages of any kind caused by their participation in the Contest, including, but not limited to, the unauthorized or illegal access to personally identifiable or sensitive information. All Entries become the property of the Sponsor and will not be acknowledged nor returned under any circumstances. Upon request of Sponsor, Entrant will provide an Affidavit of Eligibility, Publicity Release, and MACS application, as required above. Contestants will grant to Sponsor and its designees the right, except where prohibited by law, to use their names, ages, grades, likenesses, pictures, addresses (cities and states), voices, biographical information, and/or written or oral statements, for advertising, promotional, and online voting purposes in promoting the Sponsor, its products, websites, and/or this Contest, or any succeeding Contest, in any and all media now or hereafter known throughout the world in perpetuity, without additional compensation, notification, or permission. Entries not complying with all rules are subject to disqualification.

- Other technical or human error related to the Contest, execution, or administration of the Contest.

Violations: Sponsor may, in its sole determination, disqualify anyone it believes has not complied with the Rules, may be tampering or acting in a non-sportsmanlike, disruptive, abusive, harassing, or threatening manner.

Changes: Sponsor may, in its sole determination, cancel or modify any aspect of the Contest or Rules for any reason which the Sponsor, in its sole determination, deems affects the Contest, or the execution or administration of the Contest (whether tampering, technical, or human error, application of new or existing laws/regulations, or other issues).
